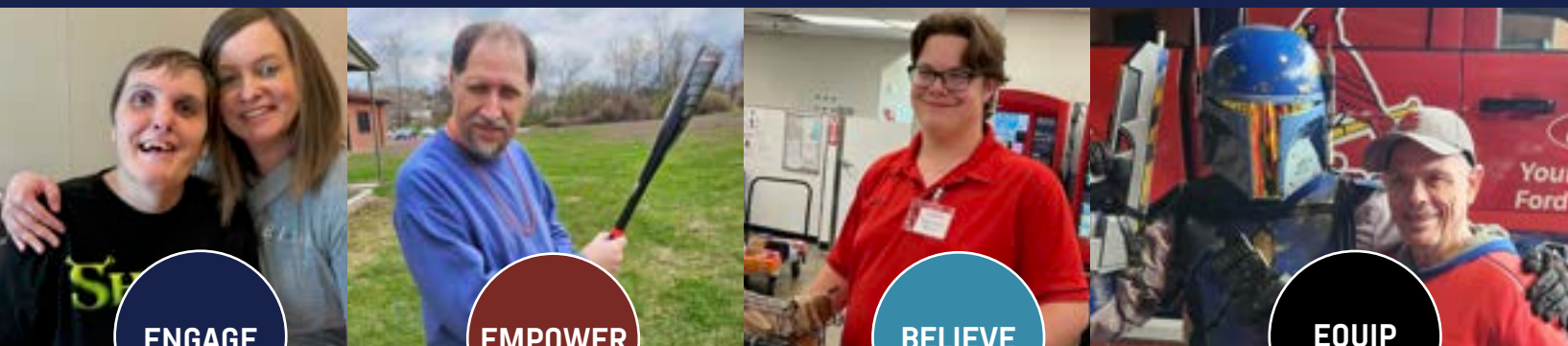
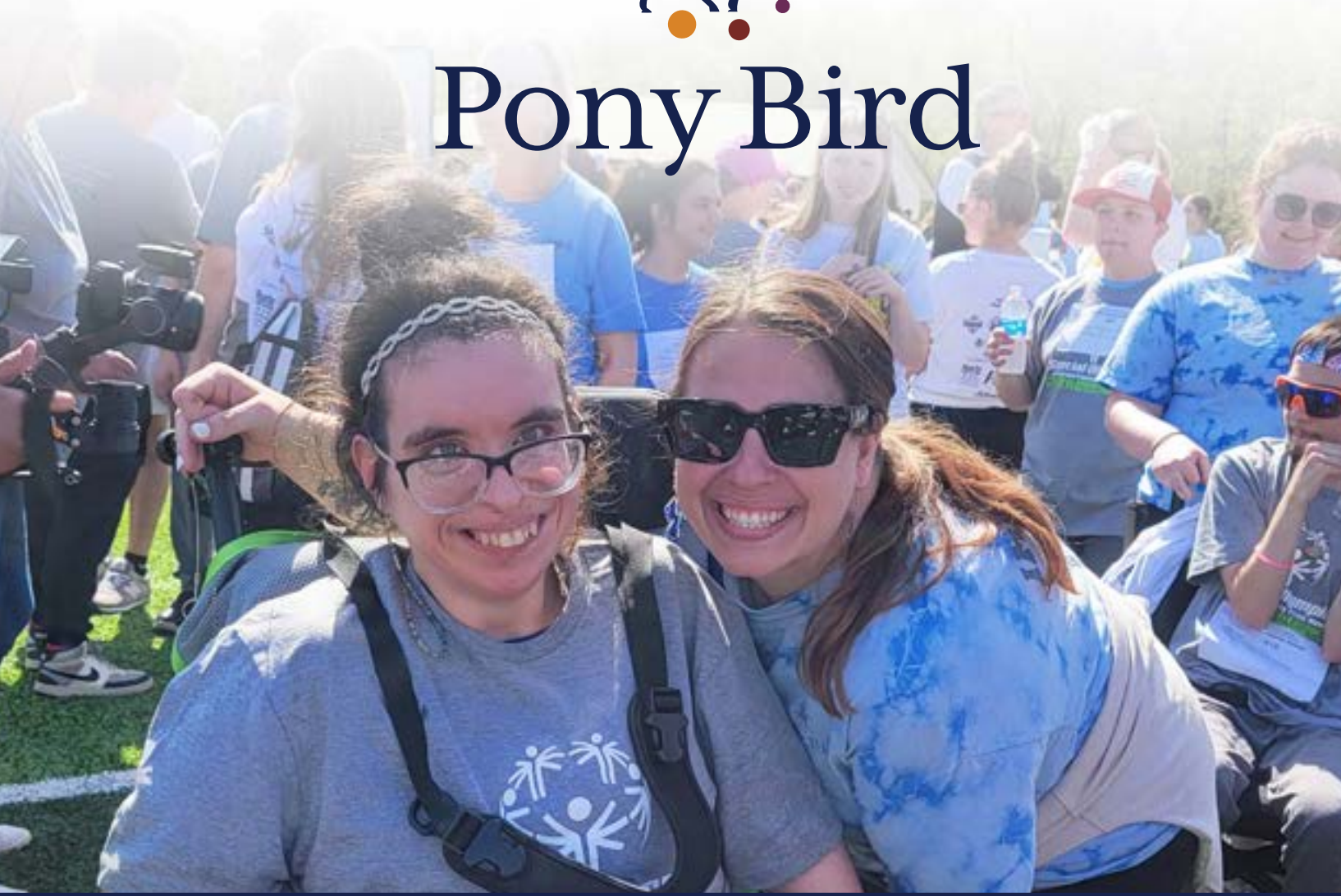

Letter from the President & CEO



Dear Pony Bird Friends, Partners, and Family,

Fall is a wonderful time of year. The season change brings cooler temps, colorful leaves, and pumpkin-spice everything. This is a great time of year to reflect on the activity that occurred throughout the summer, and preparing for growth and improvements that our summer planning produced. There's a lot of exciting things to share, and we're glad to have you as a partner in this process.

For starters, all the Board of Directors continued or renewed their service to Pony Bird for another term. This is significant as the Board provides the agency's oversight of its mission, strategy, and financial sustainability. The continuity of the Board signifies agency stability, operational consistency, and business health, all very good things. The Directors also volunteer at our events, make significant donations, and make themselves available as subject matter experts when needed.

Work has started on the Baptist Park construction remodel to establish out-of-home respite services beginning in January 2026. Respite services have not been available at Pony Bird since 2020, and a single online promotion of the 2026 services in August proved the demand is high. The plan is to produce four respite beds, and those may be used for daytime, overnight, and even extended stays. More information will be promoted throughout the fourth quarter, and we're very excited to bring back this service.

In June, Pony Bird hosted its first Volunteer Recognition Dinner held at the Herculaneum location. The evening was attended by approximately 70 current and past volunteers and featured a performance by our very own Next Steppers group. It was clear that our next event needs to be held at a larger venue, and that reflects the dedication these volunteers have to the Pony Bird mission and its individuals.

Thank you to everyone who attended the annual "Nite at the Races," it was a great event that produced much needed resources for our programs. Additionally, I look forward to seeing you at the "Great Taste" event on March 13, 2026. Please check out page nine for information on sponsorship, participation, and volunteering.

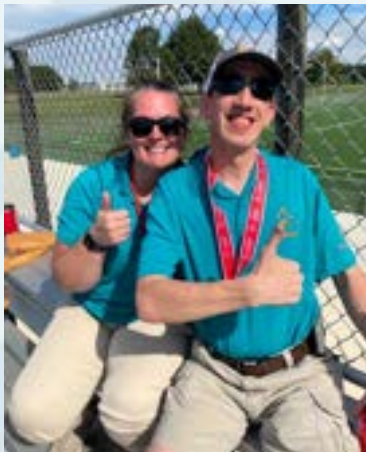
Leisure Services

Looking Forward

RESPIRE SERVICES RETURN JANUARY 2026

Pony Bird is happy to announce the return of out-of-home respite services starting January 2026. The agency has been working hard renovating the Baptist Park location to house four beds for **short and longer-term respite services**. Prior to stopping the service due to the pandemic, Pony Bird only offered one bed for its respite services. Respite Care Services

Respite care provides temporary relief for caregivers of individuals with disabilities or chronic illnesses. These services give caregivers the opportunity to attend to personal needs, run errands, or simply rest, while ensuring their loved one receives safe, attentive care.

At Pony Bird, we offer a warm, home-like environment for individuals of all ages with intellectual and developmental disabilities, available 24/7, 365 days a year. Our Overnight and Day Respite services support families in the community with children or adults requiring specialized care. We have four overnight beds and flexible Day Respite hours, scheduled according to staff availability.

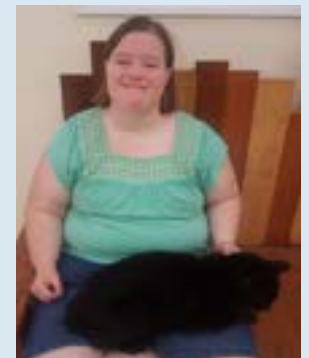
Scheduling Respite Services



Once families are accepted into the Pony Bird Respite Program, they can schedule respite stays ranging from a few hours up to two weeks, depending on availability and funding.

Due to high demand, we ask families to follow these guidelines:

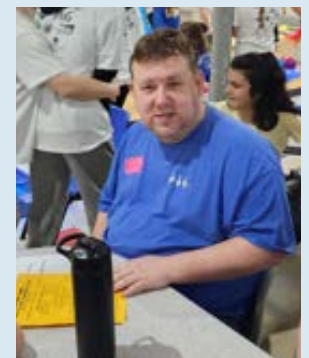
- *Schedule respite care at least two weeks in advance.*
- *Arrive on time for both drop-off and pick-up.*
- *Cancel reservations promptly if plans change.*



Service Payment

Respite funding is typically available through Medicaid waiver programs, and private pay options are also accepted. Please note that specific services and eligibility requirements may vary by waiver. Individuals interested in respite services should contact the Missouri Department of Mental Health's Division of Developmental Disabilities, or their regional office/Service Coordinator, for detailed information regarding eligibility.

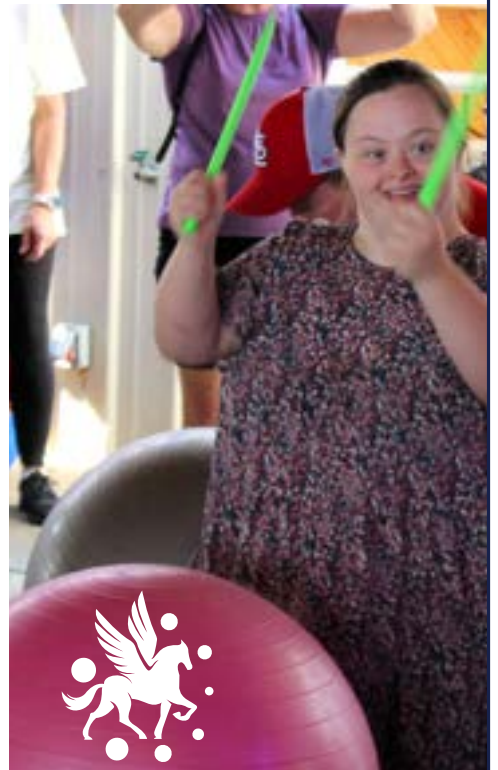
