Pony Bird is committed to ensuring decision makers understand the essential nature of these services, and we cannot do that without you. Your voice matters. Your story matters. Community Partnership Showcase

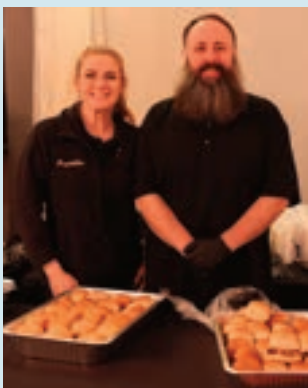

Family Support



PONY BIRD RESPITE SERVICES

In agency respite services provided by Pony Bird offer short term, out of home care for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, giving family caregivers temporary relief. Services are provided in a safe, home like setting by trained Pony Bird staff and may range from a few hours to overnight stays. While in respite care, individuals receive supervision, personal care, medication support, meals, and opportunities to participate in recreational and social activities, ensuring continuity of care while supporting family well being.

Pony Bird continues to offer the MyCare respite services, a respite voucher program that empowers families to find quality caregivers who will provide their loved one with the support and oversight they require so family members can have a break.



KIDSTART DISABILITIES AWARENESS PROGRAM

Between November and February, KDAP (Kidstart Disability Awareness Program) engaged in a variety of outreach, education, and support activities. On November 25, KDAP presented to a Cub Scout pack of approximately 25 children between the ages of 7 and 10. This was followed on December 4 by a hosted virtual financial planning presentation. On December 6, KDAP participated in the Sensitive Santa event, which served 61 children (pictured left).

In the new year, KDAP continued its educational outreach by presenting to 35 students at Seckman High School on January 22. On February 19, KDAP hosted a virtual MOABLE presentation. Throughout this period, the **MyCare program remained strong**, with approximately \$30,400 spent on respite funds from November through February, equating to roughly 2,200 hours of respite services utilized. In addition, the Lending Library continued to see steady use, with about 45 loans issued during this same time frame.

SUPPORT FOR THE TRANSITION FROM SCHOOL TO WORK

BRINGING THE BROADER COMMUNITY TOGETHER

During the past winter and spring, Pony Bird's Community Support Services (CSS) hosted and participated in a variety of meaningful events that brought individuals, families, and the broader community together.

The season began with a Thanksgiving Dinner and Play held at the Elks in Festus. Approximately 150 day program individuals and their families attended this special celebration. For months leading up to the event, day program participants rehearsed and worked creatively to build props for a play depicting the first Thanksgiving dinner. Ten individuals proudly performed in the production, which quickly became a crowd favorite and a highlight of the day.

The holiday spirit continued with a Christmas Celebration, during which a generous family volunteered their time to host a cookie-decorating station. Participants enjoyed decorating cookies together and celebrating the joy of the season.



CSS also found time to celebrate fun and community spirit. The Cardinal Baseball Opening Day Celebration, hosted at the day program, welcomed 45 participants. Everyone enjoyed barbecue, nachos, and ice cream, along with practicing pitching, hitting, and running. The day was filled with excitement as everyone cheered on the home team.

Finally, CSS launched a new weekly newsletter, The CSS Scoop. The newsletter highlights daily volunteering opportunities, afternoon station activities, and photos of participants, while also recognizing staff members, individuals served, and valued community partners.

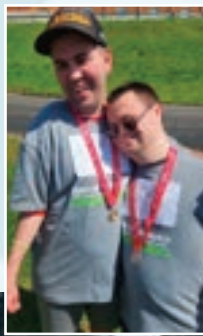

SUMMER VACATION ANNOUNCEMENT



Over the past 35+ years, our participants have suggested—and enjoyed—some truly **exciting summer vacations**. We've traveled to destinations like Chicago, Memphis, Milwaukee, Wisconsin Dells, Hershey, PA, Niagara Falls, and many more. Some trips have been Cardinal Road trips, while others were educational, adventurous, or just plain FUN. To join us on a vacation we ask that you actively participate in Leisure Services program for a minimum of one year. This allows our staff and other participants to get to know you, and it allows you to get to know us as well. When we travel out of town we have one chaperone for every five travelers. Due to financial reasons, we are unable to support individuals on trips who require higher levels of support. However, special arrangements can be made for traveling with a personal assistant for an additional cost.



This year we will follow the St. Louis Cardinals to Cincinnati in hopes for a win over the Cincinnati Reds. On August 15th, we will travel by motor coach for a three night trip with multiple stops along the way. First, we will make stops at Lexington and Louisville, KY to take in the history of thoroughbred horse racing. On our agenda are tours of Kentucky Horse Park and Churchill Downs, home of the Kentucky Derby. And to add to our baseball theme, we will also tour the Louisville Slugger museum and factory to see how our St. Louis Cardinals' bats are made. 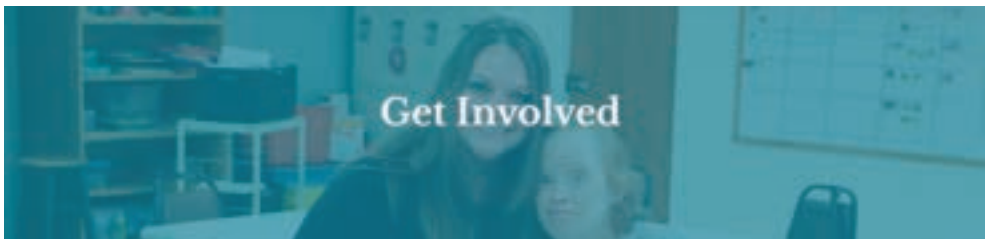

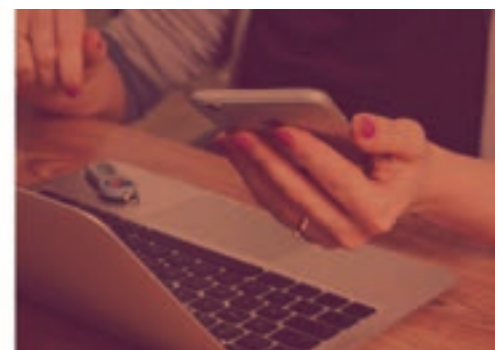

ADVOCACY IS COMMUNITY IN ACTION

Pony Bird advocates proudly joined more than a thousand others at **Disability Rights Legislative Day** at the Missouri State Capitol!

Self-advocates, parents, and team members stood together to share powerful stories and highlight the importance of protecting rights and ensuring access to critical services for individuals with disabilities across Missouri.

Prior to the Disability Rights Legislative Day, CSS hosted a parent meeting that had an outstanding turnout. During the meeting, families were educated on potential cuts to day services and how they could advocate against them. Several families created advocacy videos, while others wrote letters to their representatives to voice their concerns.

As a show of appreciation, CSS participants created handmade hearts and cards that were sent to members of the Missouri House, thanking them for their continued support of Pony Bird.
